



FRIENDS OF CAMP COLTON SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Friends of Camp Colton (FCC) Scholarship Program began as a collaborative effort between FCC and W.L. Gore & Associates Medical Products Division (GORE) to expand the reach of Camp Colton's environmental education programs to a greater number of northern Arizona children and lessen economic barriers that prevent low-income students from attending. **Scholarships are currently available for sixth-grade children from low-income/underrepresented backgrounds from northern Arizona schools.** A GORE STEM Education Grant launched the scholarship program during the 2014-15 school year and the initiative continues through the generosity of GORE, Kahtoola (Kahtoola.com) and additional donors, partners and stakeholders.

Camp Colton is owned by the Flagstaff Unified School District (FUSD) and is a 47 year-old residential environmental education center that introduces children to the wonders of the natural environment through hands-on learning experiences. Since the program began in 1971, FUSD students have attended Camp Colton at no cost as an integrated part of their classroom science studies (expense offset by FUSD, tax credit donations and funds raised by the Friends of Camp Colton). Sixth grade students from non-FUSD schools can also attend Camp Colton and pay a \$350 per student tuition fee. **Teachers/Administrators from non-FUSD schools in the northern Arizona region are invited to apply for a FCC Scholarship to offset tuition costs for their low-income students.**

The 6th Grade Camp Colton Program:

- Accompanied by classroom teachers and taught by the Camp's team of experienced environmental educators, sixth graders spend four-days and three-nights at Camp Colton learning about and connecting with the natural environment.
- Camp Colton's curriculum is standards-aligned, STEM-based, and offers an engaging schedule of environmental science programs.
 - Classes explore the following topics: wildlife, botany, aquatics, climate science, history, geology, environmental stewardship, orienteering and geocaching, outdoor skills and astronomy
 - Students participate in an estimated 25-instructional hours while at Camp Colton
 - Guest presenters from local science organizations meet with campers during the week.
- Students also enjoy team-building and traditional outdoor activities such as hikes, campfires, arts and crafts, games, and square dancing.

This four-day/three-night program is \$350 per student and accompanying teachers are free-of-cost (this price includes room and board but not transportation). To apply for scholarship funds, teachers/administrators complete the following (or online) application. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis (via mail or online at FriendsofCampColton.org) for Camp Colton's spring and fall sessions. Applications are reviewed at monthly board meetings and applicants will be notified of grant outcomes within 6 weeks of their application date.
